

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Board:

1. Accept a gift from the Los Angeles Sports Foundation (LASF), consisting of the donation of services and materials for the execution of a youth summer basketball league, and the skills training workshops as part of the Pilot Study called, "Coaching is Teaching: Instructional Strategies for Player Development," at the Lou Costello, Jr., Recreation Center, 3141 E. Olympic Boulevard, Los Angeles, 90023; and,
2. Authorize staff to issue a Right of Entry permit to the Los Angeles Sports Foundation, to conduct the skills training workshops as part of the "Coaching is Teaching: Instructional Strategies for Player Development."

SUMMARY:

The Los Angeles Sports Foundation has offered to donate services and materials (GIFT) at no cost to the City, to the Lou Costello, Jr., Recreation Center (CENTER) located in the Fourteenth Council District. The GIFT will consist of uniforms, trophies, and officiating services necessary to execute a youth summer basketball league for approximately twelve teams; also included are skills training workshops as part of LASF's Pilot Study, "Coaching is Teaching: Instructional

Strategies for Player Development.” LASF’s funding is subsidized by a grant from the Amateur Athletic Foundation (AAF). The estimated value of the GIFT is approximately \$15,000.

Based on LASF’s estimates of the cost of services and materials and the City’s review of the projected youth summer basketball league expenses, the Department is confident that the execution of the youth summer basketball league and the skills training workshops can be completed within the LASF project budget, at no direct cost to the City. The youth summer basketball league and skills training workshops by LASF are scheduled to finish by September 30, 2007.

Agreement Terms and Recognition of Donors:

The Department shall recognize the Donor by agreeing to and performing the following:

1. The terms and conditions of the Agreement shall be in effect for a period of up to six (6) months;
2. The City shall invite the Donor to all public relation events and activities involving the gift; and,
3. The City will provide and distribute marketing materials for the youth summer basketball league and skills training workshops.

FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT:

This project will have no fiscal impact on the Department, as the cost of services and materials will be funded entirely by LASF and is based on their own estimates.
