It recently came to my attention that the city is installing the gift of the "Wings of Mexico," in the viewing deck for the Hollywood sign. It is supposed to be a temporary project and on behalf of our community, we are in need to know the exact duration of this project and for how long it will be temporarily placed there until it moves downtown.

The community is NOT in support of a project like this. It has absolutely nothing to do with the site, as well as for all the reasons below. It's especially upsetting that up to \$400,000 max, was allotted for this gift, when countless times, the residents, suffering the impact of the Hollywood Sign tourism, at the Lake Hollywood Park and all heavy traffic related issues, are refused safe fencing around the park, that does not block traffic views of oncoming traffic, in this extremely tiny roadway coinciding the park, that connects the two residential areas in this location. It would also improve the appearance of this beloved tourist site with aesthetically pleasing fencing.

Without appropriate fencing, which should be installed at the cost of the city, there are numerous pedestrian issues as well, if people are trying to walk and oncoming cars can not see them. Also, the temporary fencing has also created a major eyesore and urban blight for this area.

Moreover, the city has an opportunity to clean up one of the most visited tourist sites in the city, with the appropriate fencing, that will also bring a sense of pride and safety to the park and nearby community.

As an additional financial benefit, the city could install reserved parking for all the tourists who go there, in order to alleviate the excessive traffic and regulate this more for all kinds of reasons.

So the fact that the city is spending up to this \$400,000 amount on a sculpture gift, while the community is not in support of, is extremely upsetting. It's also unfair of the city to proceed with this expense, when the need for proper fencing and parking regulation, in this high traffic tourist site, is far greater than a work of art, that the community does not want installed at the observatory site.

With that said, I'm asking your office to kindly address this traffic/fencing issue and come up with a quick resolution. And I'm also asking first, for this Wings of Mexico NOT to be installed on this site. It'd be more appropriately sited at the zoo, the Autry temporarily, before it goes downtown.

And has a traffic study been done here from both the Lake Hollywood and Beachwood sides of the sign, and around the park?

Please let me know how your office can resolve these issues for our community and that you understand the negative impacts of installing this sculpture on the observatory grounds.

Dear Eric,

Thank you for this and for providing me some additional explanations. I appreciate the dialogue on this very important subject and for receiving this message on behalf of myself as an arts professional and the Los Feliz/Hollywood community. It is my hope that we can continue this dialogue and prevent any kind of negative impact on this site and community that this project poses. So again, I greatly appreciate the opportunity to discuss and point out some glaring issues that myself and others, have identified in relation to this project.

With that said, one pressing matter, is that I'd like to kindly confirm the exact dates of this temporary installation please? The community is very confused, as some of the things AP has conveyed in recent LFNC meetings for example, are saying this is a permanent placement. For an artwork the community is not in support of, it's important to have your office clarify the temporary nature of this project and the exact duration of this installation precisely. What date will will this installation be moving downtown?

Also, this gift, which will cost the city a max. of \$400,000, I'm assuming in tax payer dollars, as described in the board report, is very concerning. It's especially unnerving that this astounding amount has been assigned to this public art work, when none of the original artworks in Griffith Park, have artist credit signage and/or some have no signage at all.

Authorize Department of Recreation and Parks (RAP) staff to commit from the following fund and work order numbers, a maximum of Four Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$400,000.00) in Park Fees, for the Project;

Also, viewing another male made artwork at the top of the observatory, will not leave room for female artists, to propose temporary works/projects there and presents an inequitable situation, and hierarchy, by keeping artworks by female artists, only at the bottom of the park entrance.

Additionally, some of the public artworks in Griffith Park, are in great need of conservation too. like other public artworks throughout the city. For example, the 1939 *Prometheus* public artwork by Iceland's National Treasure, Nina Saemundsson, who also has an uncredited artwork at entrance of Ferndell, is severely damaged and vandalized, in MacArthur Park (Parks and Recreation).

Moreover, the Wings of Mexico placement, is sorely misplaced and is more like plop art, than a work that evokes a true sense of place, and is not site-specific, therefore, disrupting the aesthetic nature of this beloved and historic place. This has absolutely nothing to do with the site and does not reflect the community in any way.

Also, the historic Hollywood sign is the "Sign of the City," and is as world-renowned, as the Griffith Park Observatory. So the prominent placement and co-opting of this site, by inserting one country name in such a prominent spot, as to take over the Hollywood sign, especially when astronomy and the stars belong to everyone, is highly problematic. I see this more as a divisive and political statement that will negatively impact this terrain. And any signage should be small, to match the similar scale of other works installed on the observatory grounds, which additional

information can be supplemented with a QR code, for example, for this selfie-platform. And what's especially concerning, is the fact that residents/neighbors of Beachwood and Lake Hollywood, near the Hollywood sign, have asked for help with the excessive Hollywood sign tourism, parking and is in desperate need of new park fencing. Yet the community are told that there are no funds to help by CD4 and the city. So this is quite upsetting to everyone that \$400,000 max is assigned to this gift and yet, we can't seem to get funds for an urgent community need.

As you know, the Wings of Mexico, is a replicated artwork, one of many vs. the original, one-of-akind, public art works currently installed in Griffith. It would be preferred that any public art work, going into this site, or anywhere in the city, goes through the normal public art process, with a call for artists, with the requirement to install works that are site-specific in any new proposals.

\*\*\*

- 1) Signage: Again, please clarify the exact signage to be installed. A smaller metal tag and a QR code is more appropriate, since the park has not given proper artist credit to any of the existing artists. Please confirm EXACT signage to be placed. This should be in the same scale as other signage.
- 2) Community Engagement: The unilateral decision to install this work, was made without any real community engagement throughout the immediate Hollywood/Los Feliz neighborhood/community, nor were, as far as I know, outside art professionals consulted. The act of garnering support after the fact, is an issue, when installing public art in general and what has unfortunately been done here. Public art is all about the community and the community process BEFORE something is unilaterally decided and plopped into an unrelated space, without taking the community/site into consideration.

Again, the neighbors, people who visit, many artists, curators and community board members, are not NOT on board with this public work in this particular site. So the fact that it will be temporary, is very important. Again, please confirm the exact duration of this temporary installation?

- 3) Not Site-Specific: The work has absolutely nothing to do with the site or community. If there is to be anything in this space, permanently, there should be a call for artists to make something that is representative of the community, like any other public art process. If anything this should be more appropriately about the Tongva people, who were the first inhabitants of this geographic location.
- 4) Political statement: Inserting this sculpture in between the two iconic Observatory and Hollywood sign, with "Wings of Mexico," large signage, seems politically motivated to me. This space should remain politically neutral and focus on astronomy, Hollywood stars and visiting, temporary, cultural activations/exhibitions, or simply be left along.
- 5) Hollywood Rams sign project: This, in many of the community's opinion, was an epic fail, as well as a waste of money.
- 6) Sculpture fits vs. sited: The fact that the measured site, technically says the sculpture will fit, doesn't mean it should be installed there. It's like putting a rectangle, in a round hole.
- 7) Does not create "A Sense of Place": In all the scholarship, regarding this notion and usage within Los Angeles City Projects now, I'm not sure why this is not being used in this particular situation.

- 8) Plop Art: Since the artwork has nothing to do with the site, it will appear as plop art and provide more of a spectacle, rather than a real art experience, that will be reflective of the many important historical, social, scientific, geographical and the anthropological layers and geography of the space.
- 9) Site should remain open and this public sculpture must have an end date assigned to it: Multi-cultural exchanges and projects are important, so this site should remain open for these possibilities, for community activations and temporary projects. Please confirm the exact duration of this temporary installation.

I'm happy to discuss this more and I hope you can appreciate what I'm saying here. Thank you for taking these comments under consideration and I hope we can continue this dialogue and get some additional clarification on this project and answers. Thank you so much.

Good afternoon Elizabeth,

Nice to meet your acquaintance, as well. Yes, I am working in coordination with the Dept of Rec and Parks to help deliver this "Wings of the City" Project for the Mayor's Office.

I have attached some information on the sculpture, "Alas de la Ciudad" ("Wings of the City"), which might be of interest for you. The sculpture was gifted to the City of LA by Mexico City in 2016. The City has explored multiple temporary locations for the sculpture, while it awaits to go to it's final destination in a future downtown park on First and Broadway.

In regards to your questions and comments:

- 1) I did receive your concerns from Lambert for the proposed signage and we have definitely decided to remove any proposed signage for the sculpture.
- 2) The sculpture is not a traveling artwork, but it is fully intended to be temporary installation at Griffith Park until the sculpture is ready to go to it's intended final location at the future downtown park.
- 3) The sculpture is proposed to be placed in the viewing plaza near the Observatory, but was purposely distanced from being on the proper Observatory grounds and the other artworks. The intent was to frame the work with the open sky and "Hollywood" sign in the foreground, connecting the work to the larger context of the City, and not the Griffith Observatory.
- 4) The Dept of Cultural Affairs has been consulted and informed of this Project. The Mayor's Office has been in communication with DCA. I have cc'd Zachia with the Mayor's Office if you would like any further information, please feel free to reach out to her.
- 5) In regards to any community outreach, the Dept of Rec and Parks has been leading those efforts. Please feel free to reach out to AP Dlaz, he is more than happy to take a call with you.
- 6) While the sculpture is relatively close to the restrooms, there is an other structure and many trees between the plaza and the restrooms which do help shield the restroom's visibility from the sculpture.
- 7) I also agree with you that it would be a great idea for the public to be able to find info on all the public artworks throughout Griffith Park. I do believe DCA might be working on an online tool to access the City Art Collection: https://culturela.org/city-art-collection/ However, perhaps there can be something organized with the Dept of Rec and Parks to specifically address the artwork of Griffith Park.

Nice to make your acquaintance. I understand you are working on the proposed Wings of Mexico project?

I'm quite curious about this proposed artwork and I'd like to know more. It's wonderful the city is proposing celebrating our Latino cultural heritage. However, I do have some questions about this work, the proposed site, as well as the type of community engagement that has been done already.

First, in terms of signage, I understand from Lambert, from the Office of Historic Resources, that the commission is no longer including the signage on the wall? Can you kindly confirm this please? And what will the commission do instead? A QR code or a small plaque on the work, like the other Wings of Mexico installations in other cities like Dubai?

Second, I'm wondering if this is a traveling, temporary exhibit? I think this would be great to see this at the civic center, union station, the zoo, autry, LACMA or Natural History Museum, or places like the Crypto Arena, DTLA etc., I'm sure the public, would love various community, event oriented activations, for selfie picture taking.

For placement, if your commission is proposing this replicated work to be permanently placed on the observatory grounds with other original artworks, in front of the Hollywood Sign viewing deck,I do believe, as an arts professional, this is problematic placement, for various cultural, socio-political issues. But please let me know the reasoning behind this and if the Dept of Cultural Affairs Public Art Dept, was consulted or not. Or if there was a public art consultant involved or not.

Also, I'm concerned that this has not had any community engagement throughout the city. For example, it looks like it was presented by A.P. Diaz to the Los Feliz Neighborhood Council recently. But since the Los Feliz Neighborhood Council, only appear to do very little outreach to the actual community, this would not be sufficient to warrant true community engagement, amongst the immediate Los Feliz Community.

Another issue, is that I think it's a bit disrespectful to place any artwork, so close to the public restroom. That's why I'm suggesting that it might be nice as a traveling, temporary exhibit or more appropriately placed at the Autry Museum even, if Griffith Park is the goal.

I also have a guite a few colleagues, with the same concerns. In discussions, what I and other professional curators, artists and members of the community, would hope for, is more for an original work of public art, that is site-specific, speaks to our multi-cultural heritage, the historic site of the Griffith Park Observatory, the WPA Era original works of public art, like the James Dean statue or the Astronomer's Monument.

It would also be nice if the commission, publicly acknowledged and credited the all the artists who created these already placed public art works throughout Griffith Park, and acknowledge these artists on the city website.

Thank you kindly for your response.

The outreach to Friends of Griffith Park and LFNC was the only outreach I know was done and that isn't representative of the entire community here. Also, the decision had already been made to install this gift here, and as far as I know, support was asked for it to be placed there after that decision was made. I'd be very interested to know what alternatives are? And why is \$400,000 being devoted to this project, when the community is in great need of fencing and such? Again, this work should not go into this observatory site for multiple reasons.

As you know, it is quite an urgent public safety matter, to have the Mullholland fencing installed, as soon as possible. Can you please provide me with an update and when this might be installed?

Again, this is a high fire severity zone, and there are the major pedestrian and traffic dangers are real for residents and tourists. So installing a permanent Muholland fence, as soon as possible, which I believe would cost around \$100,000, would assist in preventing a major fire and any further accidents posed by this temporary fence.

Tourist parking also has to be resolved and all the large tourist bus' coming up there.

Moreover, in 2023, the Hollywood sign will mark its' 100th anniversary of when the original, was first installed. And since this is an extremely frequented tourist site and beloved by everyone in Los Angeles, it would be amazing to celebrate the sign with the new fence for the Lake Hollywood Park, which is beneath the sign.

I'm also happy to speak with the Deputy Chief of Staff, Geoff Kees Thompson.

Though we understand that the Department did engage community stakeholders on the matter, the Councilmember has questions about whether previously identified funds for the project are an appropriate use given her goals to expand park access in an environmentally-sensitive manner and prioritize Griffith Park's more pressing capital improvement needs. Thank you for receiving this email.

It recently came to my attention that the city is installing the gift of the "Wings of Mexico," in the viewing deck for the Hollywood sign. It is supposed to be a temporary project and on behalf of our community, we are in need to know the exact duration of this project and for how long it will be temporarily placed there until it moves downtown.

The community is NOT in support of a project like this. It has absolutely nothing to do with the site, as well as for all the reasons below. It's especially upsetting that up to \$400,000 max, was allotted for this gift, when countless times, the residents, suffering the impact of the Hollywood Sign tourism, at the Lake Hollywood Park and all heavy traffic related issues, are refused safe fencing around the park, that does not block traffic views of oncoming traffic, in this extremely tiny roadway coinciding the park, that connects the two residential areas in this location. It would also improve the appearance of this beloved tourist site with aesthetically pleasing fencing.

Without appropriate fencing, which should be installed at the cost of the city, there are numerous pedestrian issues as well, if people are trying to walk and oncoming cars can not see them. Also, the temporary fencing has also created a major eyesore and urban blight for this area.

Moreover, the city has an opportunity to clean up one of the most visited tourist sites in the city, with the appropriate fencing, that will also bring a sense of pride and safety to the park and nearby community.

As an additional financial benefit, the city could install reserved parking for all the tourists who go there, in order to alleviate the excessive traffic and regulate this more for all kinds of reasons.

So the fact that the city is spending up to this \$400,000 amount on a sculpture gift, while the community is not in support of, is extremely upsetting. It's also unfair of the city to proceed with this expense, when the need for proper fencing and parking regulation, in this high traffic tourist site, is far greater than a work of art, that the community does not want installed at the observatory site.

With that said, I'm asking your office to kindly address this traffic/fencing issue and come up with a guick resolution. And I'm also asking first, for this Wings of Mexico NOT to be installed on this site. It'd be more appropriately sited at the zoo, the Autry temporarily, before it goes downtown.

And has a traffic study been done here from both the Lake Hollywood and Beachwood sides of the sign, and around the park?

Please let me know how your office can resolve these issues for our community and that you understand the negative impacts of installing this sculpture on the observatory grounds.

Thank you for this and for providing me some additional explanations. I appreciate the dialogue on this very important subject and for receiving this message on behalf of myself as an arts professional and the Los Feliz/Hollywood community. It is my hope that we can continue this dialogue and prevent any kind of negative impact on this site and community that this project poses. So again, I greatly appreciate the opportunity to discuss and point out some glaring issues that myself and others, have identified in relation to this project.

With that said, one pressing matter, is that I'd like to kindly confirm the exact dates of this temporary installation please? The community is very confused, as some of the things AP has conveyed in recent LFNC meetings for example, are saying this is a permanent placement. For an artwork the community is not in support of, it's important to have your office clarify the temporary nature of this project and the exact duration of this installation precisely. What date will will this installation be moving downtown?

Also, this gift, which will cost the city a max. of \$400,000, I'm assuming in tax payer dollars, as described in the board report, is very concerning. It's especially unnerving that this astounding amount has been assigned to this public art work, when none of the original artworks in Griffith Park, have artist credit signage and/or some have no signage at all.

Authorize Department of Recreation and Parks (RAP) staff to commit from the following fund and work order numbers, a maximum of Four Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$400,000.00) in Park Fees, for the Project;

Also, viewing another male made artwork at the top of the observatory, will not leave room for female artists, to propose temporary works/projects there and presents an inequitable situation, and hierarchy, by keeping artworks by female artists, only at the bottom of the park entrance.

Additionally, some of the public artworks in Griffith Park, are in great need of conservation too, like other public artworks throughout the city. For example, the 1939 *Prometheus* public artwork by Iceland's National Treasure, Nina Saemundsson, who also has an uncredited artwork at entrance of Ferndell, is severely damaged and vandalized, in MacArthur Park (Parks and Recreation).

Moreover, the Wings of Mexico placement, is sorely misplaced and is more like plop art, than a work that evokes a true sense of place, and is not site-specific, therefore, disrupting the aesthetic nature of this beloved and historic place. This has absolutely nothing to do with the site and does not reflect the community in any way.

Honorable Recreations and Parks Commissioners, General Manager Michael Shull, and Assistant General Manager Jimmy Kim:

Today the City Council passed a motion that will allow LADOT to resume towing of vehicles used as dwellings effective May 15, 2022. The matter is identified as Council File 21-0956.

I am attaching the links you and/or your legal team will need to begin the enforcement process in the lot in Westchester Park that is under the jurisdiction of the General Services Division, and also in the other two lots of the park which are under RAP jurisdiction.

The number of vehicles used as dwellings in the parking lots of that park has increased significantly in the last few months. We understand the Sheriff will be in Venice from Memorial Day to Labor Day, and we fully expect that many RVs will move to Westchester Park.

Park curfew signs are posted in all three parking lots in the park stating vehicles in violation of the park curfew will be towed pursuant to LAMC 63.44. The parking lot under General Services Division jurisdiction is heavily used by park goers. We have been informed by park rangers that towing and enforcement in lots in other parks under GSD jurisdiction is taking place despite the moratorium because LAMC 63.44 "no parking" after curfew signs are posted in the lots in those parks. (See LAMC 86.03.)

Now the City Council has acted, and we request the following:


- 1. Enforcement in all three parking lots of the park begin no later than May 15, 2022.
- 2. The installation of t-bar gates at the entrance and exit of each parking lot so the gates may be closed and locked during park curfew to ensure no vehicle dwellers park in the parking lots of the park in violation of park curfew.

Thank you for all of your work in making the park safe for seniors and youth athletes. Our community is grateful for your efforts.
